AHCA has issued the following memorandum in regard to <u>Guidance on Emerging</u> <u>Infection Candida Auris.</u> C. auris is an emerging yeast that can be misidentified as other organisms, is multidrug-resistant, and can spread in health care settings. The April 14th edition of the New York Timesincluded an article <u>here.</u> It is important to know how to identify, treat, and control the spread of this organism. The resources on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention <u>website</u> meant for laboratorians, clinicians, infection control practitioners, and public health professionals are very helpful and we encourage you to review them.
