RE: Tuberculosis Screening, Testing and Treatment of Healthcare Personnel

The purpose of this memorandum is to inform Massachusetts Health Care Facilities of updates to tuberculosis (TB) testing best practices and Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH) resources for developing and implementing facility-based policies.

In May 2019, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the National Tuberculosis Controllers Association released updated guidelines for TB screening, testing and treatment of health care personnel (HCP). DPH strongly encourages adoption of these guidelines.<sup>1</sup> Because of the overall decrease of TB cases and low incidence of TB among HCP due to occupational exposure, <u>routine</u> practice of annual testing is no longer recommended for HCP. The recommendations for facility risk assessments and infection control practices did not change from the 2005 guidelines.

Because of the updates in best practice, DPH is rescinding circular letter DHCQ 07-07-477 and will remove the following associated documents from its website:

- Policy: Tuberculosis Testing and Treatment for Nursing Homes and Rest Homes
- Two Step Skin Testing: Nursing Home and Rest Home Residents
- Targeted Testing and Treatment of Latent Tuberculosis Infection

Please review your health care facility's TB screening, testing and treatment policies with your infection prevention and occupational health team members to ensure they align with these updated recommendations.
